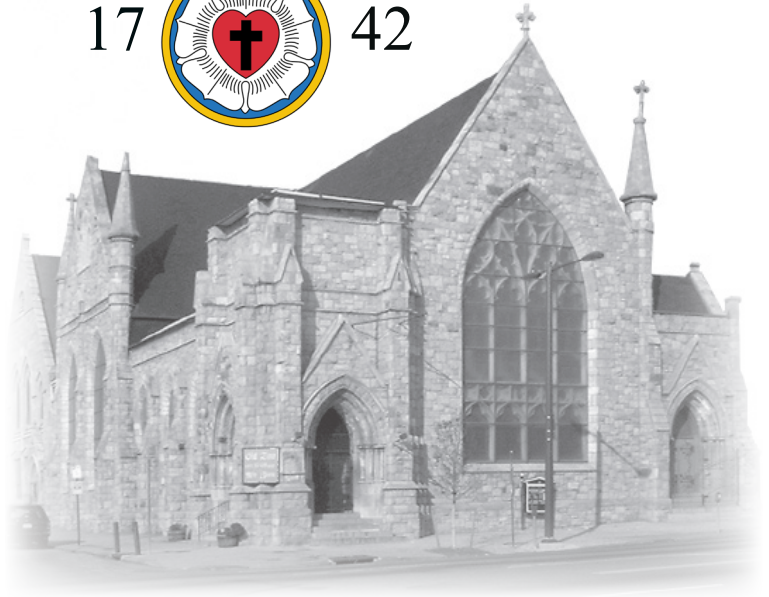

A word from Pastor:

From Luther’s Large Catechism, “The Lord’s Prayer”

After developing the point at some length that the Lord has commanded us to pray, Luther speaks about the promise which our Lord has made that He will hear us: “In the second place, we should be the more urged and incited to pray because God has also added a promise, and declared that it shall surely be done to us as we pray, as He says Ps. 50:15, Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver thee.” And Christ in the Gospel of St. Matthew, 7:7: Ask, and it shall be given you. For every one that asketh receiveth. Such promises ought certainly to encourage and kindle our hearts to pray with pleasure and delight, since He testifies with His own word that our prayer is heartily pleasing to Him, moreover, that it shall assuredly be heard and granted, in order that we may not despise it or think lightly of it, and pray at a venture (that is, with uncertainty about whether our prayer will be heard—Pastor’s note).

You can hold this up to Him and say, “Here I come, dear Father, and pray, not of my own purpose nor upon my own worthiness, but at Thy commandment and promise, which cannot fail or deceive me....”

Mike Anderson, LCDR, USNR (a member of Old Zion!) Mike has recently been called to active duty in Japan. Mike graduated from Harvard and earned a Master's Degree in Counseling from Yale.

Philip Stewart, Captain, USAF, Davis-Monthan AFB, Tucson, AZ. Before going to Arizona, Phil preached for us here at Old Zion. He was awarded a Doctorate in Theology from the University of Munich and is fluent in German, French, and Spanish.

T.C. Judd, Lt. Col., TANG, Houston, TX. While continuing to serve as a chaplain, T.C. is currently also very active in our church-body, providing a format on “Zoom” where the chaplains and all the other pastors in the ELCM can meet, discuss issues, and have fellowship together.

Pastor Paul Schweinler, Fort Lauderdale. Paul is not really connected with the military; instead, he works with a government agency in Florida to provide emergency counseling for those who have been traumatized by hurricanes, earthquakes, the pandemic, and the like. Needless to say, he is kept very busy these days.

The veteran “guiding-light” for these chaplains is retired Chaplain **Russel Burr**, Lt. Col. USAR. Chaplain Burr also serves currently as the ELCM's Endorsing Agent.

Fellowship Hall Rental Opportunities

Now that we have incorporated climate control elements into our lovely Fellowship Hall, the council of **Old Zion Lutheran Church** has made the Fellowship Hall available to members, friends, and those in the greater community on a rental basis for various functions, meetings, and events.

The Fellowship Hall is ideal for meetings and classes, small cabaret performances or recitals, and personal celebrations (anniversaries, birthdays, etc). The hall can be rented on an hourly basis at \$150 per hour, or for a larger block of time at a discounted rate (4 hours for \$500). Ongoing rentals can also be considered.

Aside from both heating and cooling to meet your needs, the Fellowship Hall has space for approximately 70-90 people. We can provide tables and chairs to accommodate your guests, easy access to bathrooms, and space to put out any refreshments you may wish to serve. Basic wifi is provided, as is a large projector screen that can be pulled down for your convenience. We ask that any decorations be approved prior to use.
