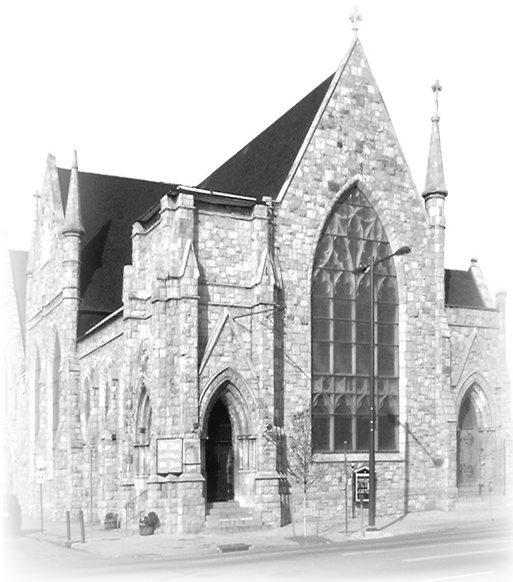

Order of Worship at 10 AM
Prelude

Opening Hymn “Immortal, invisible, God only wise” #172 v.1-4

Congregation shall stand on the last verse of the hymn

Minister (M): In the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Response (R): Amen.**

M: Beloved in the Lord! Let us draw near with a true heart, and confess our sins unto God our Father, beseeching him, in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to grant us forgiveness.

M: Our help is in the Name of the Lord.
 R: Who made heaven and earth.

M: I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord.
 R: And thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin.

M: Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer, we poor sinners confess unto thee, that we are by nature sinful and unclean, and that we have sinned against thee by thought, word, and deed. Wherefore we flee for refuge to thine infinite mercy, seeking and imploring thy grace, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ.

R: O most merciful God, who hast given thine only-begotten Son to die for us, have mercy upon us, and for his sake grant us remission of all our sins; and by thy Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of thee and of thy will, and true obedience to thy Word, that by thy grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

M: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, hath had mercy upon us, and hath given his only Son to die for us, and for his sake forgiveth us all our sins. To them that believe on his Name, he giveth power to become the sons of God, and bestoweth upon them his Holy Spirit. He that believeth, and is baptized, shall be saved. Grant this, O Lord, unto us all.

R: Amen.

Introit (*sung by the Soloist - found on p 100*)

Gloria Patri (*sung by all, p 17*): Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost: as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Kyrie (*p 18*)

M: In peace let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, have mercy.

M: For the peace that is from above, and for the salvation of our souls, let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, have mercy.

M: For the peace of the whole world, for the well-being of the churches of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, have mercy.

M: For this holy house, and for them that in faith, piety and fear of God offer here their worship and praise, let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, have mercy.

M: Help, save, pity and defend us, O God, by thy grace.

R: Amen.

Gloria in Excelsis (pp 20-21)

M: Glory be to God on high!

℞: And on earth peace, good will toward men. We praise thee, we bless thee, we worship thee, we glorify thee, we give thanks to thee for thy great glory. O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father Almighty.

O Lord, the only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ: O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, that takest away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the sin of the world, receive our prayer. Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us.

For thou, only art holy: thou only art the Lord; thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art most high in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

M: The Lord be with you.

℞: And with thy spirit.

M: Let us pray.
